



# Is the solar system a planetary system

Why is our planetary system called the Solar System?

Our planetary system is called "the solar system" because we use the word "solar" to describe things related to our star, after the Latin word for Sun, "solis." So far, we've only know about life on Earth, but NASA is searching for life on other worlds in our solar system and beyond.

What is a planetary system?

The solar system is also known as a planetary system. Since the 1990s scientists have found many planetary systems beyond our solar system. In these systems, one or more planets orbit a star--just as the eight planets in our solar system orbit the Sun. These planets are called extrasolar planets.

How many planets are in our Solar System?

Our solar system includes the Sun, eight planets, five officially named dwarf planets, and hundreds of moons, and thousands of asteroids and comets. Our solar system is located in the Milky Way, a barred spiral galaxy with two major arms, and two minor arms.

How do planetary systems come to be?

The layout of our solar system provided the first clues for how planetary systems come to be. All of the planets circle the Sun in the same direction, and their orbits all lie in nearly the same plane.

Which planets are in the inner Solar System?

The inner solar system contains the Sun, Mercury, Venus, Earth and Mars: The main asteroid belt (not shown) lies between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter. The planets of the outer solar system are Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune (Pluto is now classified as a dwarf planet): The first thing to notice is that the solar system is mostly empty space.

What is the Solar System made up of?

Our solar system is made up of the sun and all the amazing objects that travel around it. The universe is filled with billions of star systems. Located inside galaxies, these cosmic arrangements are made up of at least one star and all the objects that travel around it, including planets, dwarf planets, moons, asteroids, comets, and meteoroids.

The rest of the Solar System is its eight major planets, five dwarf planets, hundreds of moons, and a large number of comets, asteroids, and other small bodies of rock and ice. The extent of the Solar System is defined by the solar wind -- particles driven by the Sun's magnetic field -- and gravitational influence.

The solar system came into being about 4.5 billion years ago when a cloud of interstellar gas and dust collapsed, resulting in a solar nebula, a swirling disc of material that collided to form the solar system. The solar system is located in the Milky Way's Orion star cluster.
