Density of Mercury: 5.428 gm/cm<sup>3</sup>: Mercury is the second densest planet of our solar system after the Earth (5.514 gm/cm<sup>3</sup>). If we do not consider gravitational compression for both planets then Mercury would be denser than earth. Without considering gravitational compression the Mercury's density would be 5.3 gm/cm<sup>3</sup> while the earth's density would be around 4.4 gm/cm<sup>3</sup>.

Besides knowing the planets" order, we must also insert planets into one of two category systems. The first classification system labels planets by size and composition: The first four planets in order from the Sun--Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars--are all small, with rocky surfaces and orbits close to one another.

There are eight planets in the solar system: Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune.
