Can you recycle batteries?

Throwing away batteries, especially rechargeable batteries, can pose risks to people, property, and the environment. Call2Recycle makes it easy to recycle your batteries instead. Just Collect, Protect and Drop Off your used batteries at one of our participating drop-off locations across the U.S.

Where can I recycle a dead battery?

Call2Recycle is one of the companies that offer mail-in battery recycling kits. The kit comes with a container that you can use to collect dead single-use batteries. When the container gets full, you can mail your alkaline batteries to a recycling center.

Does home depot recycle batteries?

The Home Depot has partnered with Call2Recycle, a nonprofit battery recycling program. Rechargeable batteries can be dropped off in Call2Recycle bins at the store. Any rechargeable battery that weighs up to 11 pounds and is under 300 watt hours is accepted. There's no charge for recycling.

Where can I recycle button batteries?

Button cells contain silver and mercury. They must be recycled. You can take them to Call2Recycle drop-off sites, like those at The Home Depot. Watch repair shops may also take these batteries for recycling. Keep all batteries out of the reach of children, but especially button batteries.

California Electronic Waste Recycling Act In 2004 the state of California passed a law which requires retailers to collect an advanced recovery fee when a consumer purchases a new television or monitor. The fee is deposited in a fund managed by the state of California, which was created to finance recycling of unwanted electronics.

Many drop-off services offer battery recycling for free, while some sites require a small charge. Mail-in battery recycling programs are more convenient, but you'll pay for the service, with services like WeRecycle starting at \$44.95 for the smallest mail-in option. Recycle phone batteries

Depending on which kind of battery you are recycling, battery components can become many different new products. Battery manufacturers frequently recycle spent battery components directly into new batteries. Steel can be recycled into kitchenware such as pots and pans, and silverware or cups and plates. It can sometimes be turned into asphalt.

If you want to store your batteries with the care of a scientist, Dickerson says, one of the safest options is to hold on to the original packing and reuse it to house the spent batteries. That's what he does. "You can use a permanent marker to mark the old batteries so you don't get them confused with the new ones," he says.

T-Mobile handles various types of devices and batteries. Federal and state laws regulate how batteries and devices are recycled. The T-Mobile recycling program complies with those laws and gives consumers a way to properly and safely recycle these items. T-Mobile requires suppliers and partners that repair and recycle these devices to be certified to the industry leading R2 ...

Most cell phone batteries are lithium-ion batteries, which require special transportation for recycling, so this is especially important if using a manufacturer's mail-back program. Use the Recycling Locator to find a drop-off location near you.
