



# Where do you recycle old batteries

Where can I recycle a battery?

Start local. Your town's website is always a great place to begin. Chances are, you'll learn about battery recycling in the section listing "other types" of recycling. Use these handy tools. If you're looking to discover where to dispose of batteries, both Earth911 and Call2Recycle offer online resources to help.

Can you recycle a car battery?

Car batteries, rechargeable batteries (including AA, 9-volt, the one in the back of your cell phone, and the like), and even button cell watch batteries contain heavy metals and other toxic chemicals. Recycling batteries like these is often required by law.

How do you dispose of batteries?

You must take batteries to an authorized recycling center, a universal waste handler or a household hazardous waste disposal facility. When you know how to dispose of batteries, you can help the environment. Dropoff sites typically accept rechargeable batteries for recycling. For single-use batteries, you can get a mail-order recycling kit.

Where can I drop off old batteries?

How do you use a battery recycling container?

It's easy to use--simply fill it with batteries and ship it to a recycling facility--and a pre-addressed shipping label, home pickup, and recycling fees are included in the cost of the container.

Does home depot recycle batteries?

The Home Depot has partnered with Call2Recycle, a nonprofit battery recycling program. Rechargeable batteries can be dropped off in Call2Recycle bins at the store. Any rechargeable battery that weighs up to 11 pounds and is under 300 watt hours is accepted. There's no charge for recycling.

If you want to store your batteries with the care of a scientist, Dickerson says, one of the safest options is to hold on to the original packing and reuse it to house the spent batteries. That's what he does. "You can use a permanent marker to mark the old batteries so you don't get them confused with the new ones," he says.

**Battery Recycling Location.** Where you can recycle batteries will vary depending on your location and state and local laws for disposal of batteries. Single-use batteries are more difficult to recycle than rechargeable batteries that contain valuable heavy metals that can be reused. **Important Notes on Recycling or Disposing of Batteries:** When preparing batteries for recycling or disposal, always cover the electrical connections or battery terminals with a non-conductive tape (electrical or vinyl) or seal individual batteries in separate plastic bags so they cannot conduct electricity. This helps eliminate potential fire or ...

When it's time to get rid of the batteries, start by checking local ordinances. A few cities and towns will recycle any batteries for you if you just leave them in a plastic bag on top of your trashcan. About half of states have laws mandating specific disposal methods for consumers.

I've seen a common trend among these battery recycling solutions. In most cases, they'll sell you a recycling package. Basically, you'll put dead batteries in these boxes, and once they're full, you can mail them back. Cirba Solutions is the industry leader in battery recycling.

If none of the options above work for you, there is a final way -- pay for someone to pick up and recycle your lead acid battery for you. You do this by buying a battery recycling kit. Call2Recycle sells a Small Battery Recycling Box suited for around 20-25 pounds of batteries and a Large Battery Recycling Box suited for around 40-50 pounds.

Visit RecycleNation for recycling sites for single-use batteries, rechargeable, and automotive batteries. You can also call 1-800-RECYCLING. Visit Call2Recycle to locate the closest battery drop-off location. Ask your local auto parts store or auto service shop if they will accept automotive batteries for recycling.

Fortunately, alkaline batteries haven't contained harmful materials for over 25 years, and the U.S. passed a law in 1996 phasing out the use of mercury in batteries, so progress has been made. In fact, unless you live in California, you've been tossing non-rechargeable batteries safely in the trash for at least 19 years.

Infact, returning car battery to walmart is very simple. They take old car used batteries for recycling as Walmart recycle batteries.. You can bring your old car battery to the Customer Service desk at your local Walmart store, and they will dispose of it for you. Walmart battery recycling program is very convenient.
